### **2 Samuel 11: 1 – 5, 14 - 21 (RSV) Revised Standard Version**

In the spring of the year, the time when kings go forth to battle, David sent Jo'ab, and his servants with him, and all Israel; and they ravaged the Ammonites, and besieged Rabbah. But David remained at Jerusalem.<sup>2</sup> It happened, late one afternoon, when David arose from his couch and was walking upon the roof of the king's house, that he saw from the roof a woman bathing; and the woman was very beautiful. <sup>3</sup> And David sent and inquired about the woman. And one said, "Is not this Bathshe'ba, the daughter of Eli'am, the wife of Uri'ah the Hittite?" <sup>4</sup> So David sent messengers, and took her; and she came to him, and he lay with her. (Now she was purifying herself from her uncleanness.) Then she returned to her house. <sup>5</sup> And the woman conceived; and she sent and told David, "I am with child."

<sup>14</sup> In the morning David wrote a letter to Jo'ab, and sent it by the hand of Uri'ah. <sup>15</sup> In the letter he wrote, "Set Uri'ah in the forefront of the hardest fighting, and then draw back from him, that he may be struck down, and die." <sup>16</sup> And as Jo'ab was besieging the city, he assigned Uri'ah to the place where he knew there were valiant men. <sup>17</sup> And the men of the city came out and fought with Jo'ab; and some of the servants of David among the people fell. Uri'ah the Hittite was slain also. <sup>18</sup> Then Jo'ab sent and told David all the news about the fighting; <sup>19</sup> and he instructed the messenger, "When you have finished telling all the news about the fighting to the king, <sup>20</sup> then, if the king's anger rises, and if he says to you, 'Why did you go so near the city to fight? Did you not know that they would shoot from the wall?' <sup>21</sup> Who killed Abim'elech the son of Jerub'esheth? Did not a woman cast an upper millstone upon him from the wall, so that he died at Thebez? Why did you go so near the wall?' then you shall say, 'Your servant Uri'ah the Hittite is dead also.'"
